The president of the CSVEI, Anne Daems, welcomes all and reminds everyone that live translation is provided in French.

- **Follow-up of the BUREX meeting held on May 19, 2026**

The various items on the agenda of this plenary session were discussed in the BUR.EX as part of the preparation. In accordance with the CSVEI Rules of Procedure, the BUR.EX systematically meets no later than three weeks before each plenary session.

- **CSVEI Budget**

The budget proposal for the year 2027 amounts to €51,460 and has been approved by the General Inspectorate of Finance (IGF), subject to the use of the budget allocated for 2026 (a total of €53,000). The list of people to be interviewed as part of the study will be expanded, with the possibility of organising, a feedback event for example. Three conferences will be organised by the CSVEI between September and December 2026.

It is also possible to request a legal opinion on a specific topic from a professional or to organise training sessions with external service providers. Any CSVEI member may submit a request, which will then be discussed in a plenary session.

- **Conferences organised by the CSVEI**

The three proposed conferences have been selected:

- A conference with Camille Peugny, author of the essay *Le triomphe des égoïsmes*, to address the issue of social cohesion in Luxembourg.
- A conference with Marc Berna, HRS Director, focusing on intercultural management at the workplace.
- A conference with William Grech, offering a pragmatic perspective on the challenges and opportunities related to integration in Malta, a country facing an unprecedented demographic shift. These insights resonate with the reality in Luxembourg, where nearly half of the population consists of people of different nationalities.

These conferences are open to the public and included in the Biergerpakt calendar. CSVEI members are invited to attend these conferences as far as possible and to promote them within their networks.

- **Update PAN AR**

Four working groups have been set up around the flagship actions for 2026:

- Training courses
- Support for victims
- Label
- Campaign on microaggressions

At this stage, not all working groups have met yet.

The call for projects under the PAN AR includes two components: – one related to the microaggressions campaign, – the other dedicated to projects targeting adolescents and pupils. Projects submitted with a budget of €10,000 or more may be funded under this scheme.

In addition, a [call for projects](#) under the AMIF Fund (Asylum, Migration and Integration) is currently open, with a deadline of 24 July, for the funding of projects in Luxembourg.

- **Training on the topic of antiracism (30 June 2026)**

A training session on antiracism will be offered to CSVEI members on **30 June 2026**. Pierre Weiss from the Division Vivre ensemble developed the content and will deliver the training.

This training is part of one of the PAN AR actions: “Outiller le Conseil supérieur du vivre-ensemble interculturel dans sa mission de « contribuer à promouvoir le vivre-ensemble interculturel, y compris la lutte contre le racisme et toutes formes de discrimination » notamment par des formations, le partage de documents ou la participation à des événements dédiés.”

Furthermore, the PAN AR foresees the development of training programmes for the private and public sectors. The content of these training courses will be developed by CEFIS.

- **Follow-up on the Biergerpakt working group on April 20 and June 8, 2026**

Since the last plenary session, the Biergerpakt working group has met twice to exchange on activities, various projects, and the new Biergerpakt website.

It was suggested that Anne Franziskus and Jacques Brosius, Biergerpakt coordinators within the Division Vivre ensemble, present the current state of the Biergerpakt, including the new website, during the plenary session scheduled for 22 September 2026.

A national Biergerpakt campaign, including a “toutes boîtes” distribution, is planned for the end of June.

Part 2

Presentation of the results of the ELIR-OMVEI 2024 Study on Social Cohesion in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg (Cohort 1, Wave 1)

Following the presentation, it generally emerges that first-time arrivals in 2023, originating from non-EU countries and without a university degree, show a stronger interest in learning Luxembourgish and in participating in life in Luxembourg than other groups.

Language skills are an important factor for employability and facilitate connections with other people.
